









The "Tuesday Crew " led the singing as we made our way along the Union Canal before stopping for lunch at Almondell







# Remembrance 2022, Lest we Forget

Deconstructed Toffee Apple, sliced apple drizzled with golden syrup and covered in sprinkles






Residents in Spring Gardens enjoyed some celebrations for St Andrews Day and toasted his health all enjoyed a visit from Hamish the West Highland Terrier.
