Pumpkin Pie Recipe

1lb of pumpkin flesh peeled and diced

2 eggs plus one yolk

3oz brown sugar

1 teaspoon of cinnamon, half teaspoon of nutmeg, allspice, cloves and ground ginger

10fl oz double cream

Place the pumpkin chunks in the oven to roast till tender, let it cool before adding the whisked eggs, brown sugar, spices and cream and whisk to combine thoroughly. Pour filling into the pastry case and bake at 180c / Gas 4 for 35-40 minutes. Allow to cool before serving with crème fraiche or whipped



Trip to Dobbies










